- 2. Use sticky notes to make annotations for the literary elements listed above directly in the novel. If you need sticky notes, come see me.
- 3. You should have at least one sticky note per chapter for one of the literary terms.
- 4. You should also note a summary of important plot information for each section in a document.

We strongly advocate for leisure reading as well. Engaging with books, magazines, and newspapers over the summer will not only broaden your knowledge but also keep your reading skills honed, which will prove beneficial in all your classes next year.
